Providing training to the midday supervisors for the introduction of playground games at lunchtime by way of lunchtime supervision by sports coach three times per week.	<p>To increase the expertise of the lunchtime staff and to improve the general running of the playground at lunchtime.</p> <p>To improve behaviour and generate a team spirit amongst the children over the lunchtime period.</p>
